She has had an extensive opera, oratorio, cabaret and concert career in North America, Europe, and French Polynesia, working with many of the world's greatest Conductors, Directors, Orchestras, chamber musicians, teachers, coaches, and fellow singers/actors.

Jacqui has had the honour of Premiering a host of New Works around the globe, many in the presence of the composers/ librettists, and makes a point of including Canadian and modern works along with the well-known and beloved repertoire as often as possible. She often gives or participates in Benefit Concerts for such causes as AIDS research, The Food Bank, Motility Diseases, Flood and Earthquake Relief, Autism Spectrum Disorders, Special Olympics and the Make a Wish Foundation, to name just a few.
