Training in acting and related areas:

My early training included singing, elocution (spoken arts) and dance.

From 1951 to 1953 I trained full time on a Middlesex County Council scholarship at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London, England. This was a professional course geared to providing me with the requisite skills to perform on stage and off (e.g. broadcasting) in both singing and acting.

Work experience:

Before, during and following my Guildhall training, I freelanced as a singer in chamber ensembles, concert productions of opera (Hansel in *Hansel and Gretel*; Cherubino in *The Marriage of Figaro*; and Dorabella in *Cosi Fan Tutte*), BBC solo recitals in Glasgow and Edinburgh, and frequent performances as soloist with Scottish societies in and around London.

From 1953 to 1957, I was employed continuously by **Holiday on Ice (Great Britain)** as a "voice over" in various skating extravaganzas in London and throughout Britain. These included *Coronation Ice Cavalcade*, various musicals; e.g. *The Dancing Years* (Ivor Novello), *Rose Marie* (Rudolph Friml) and Christmas pantomimes. All of these performances included both singing and speaking roles.

Following emigration to Canada in 1965, I obtained a Bachelor of Education degree and was employed from 1971 to 1988 by Regina Public School Board at both elementary and high school levels. During that time I worked in an extra-curricular capacity as vocal coach and drama director.
