As a concert artist, Ms. Latham has been the soloist for numerous works including Handel's MESSIAH and DIXIT DOMINUS, Rossini's MISSA SOLENNELLE, Haydn's LORD NELSON MASS, Mozart's CORONATION MASS and Vivaldi's GLORIA and BEATUS VIR.

In concert and recital, Ms. Latham has performed throughout Canada and the United States, including her Carnegie Hall debut for the Marilyn Horne Foundation.

Ms. Latham is currently appearing as *Sister Sophia* in the Mirvish production of THE SOUND OF MUISC at the Princess of Wales Theatre in Toronto.
