Céline Lomez, and her twin sister Liette, started out as a singing act and first enjoyed wide popularity when they were the hit of the Festival du Disque in Québec in 1968. Shortly after that Céline was offered a role in the Denis Héroux film, L'Initiation.

Although Céline and Liette stopped performing together that year, Céline released a solo 45 and continued to have a highly successful career as a singer as well as becoming a more accomplished actor. In 1974, she landed one of her most important roles when she was cast in the title role of *Gina* by director, <u>Denys</u> Arcand.

Of special note, the music for *The Silent Partner* was written by Oscar Peterson and he titled one of his compositions, Theme for Céline.
